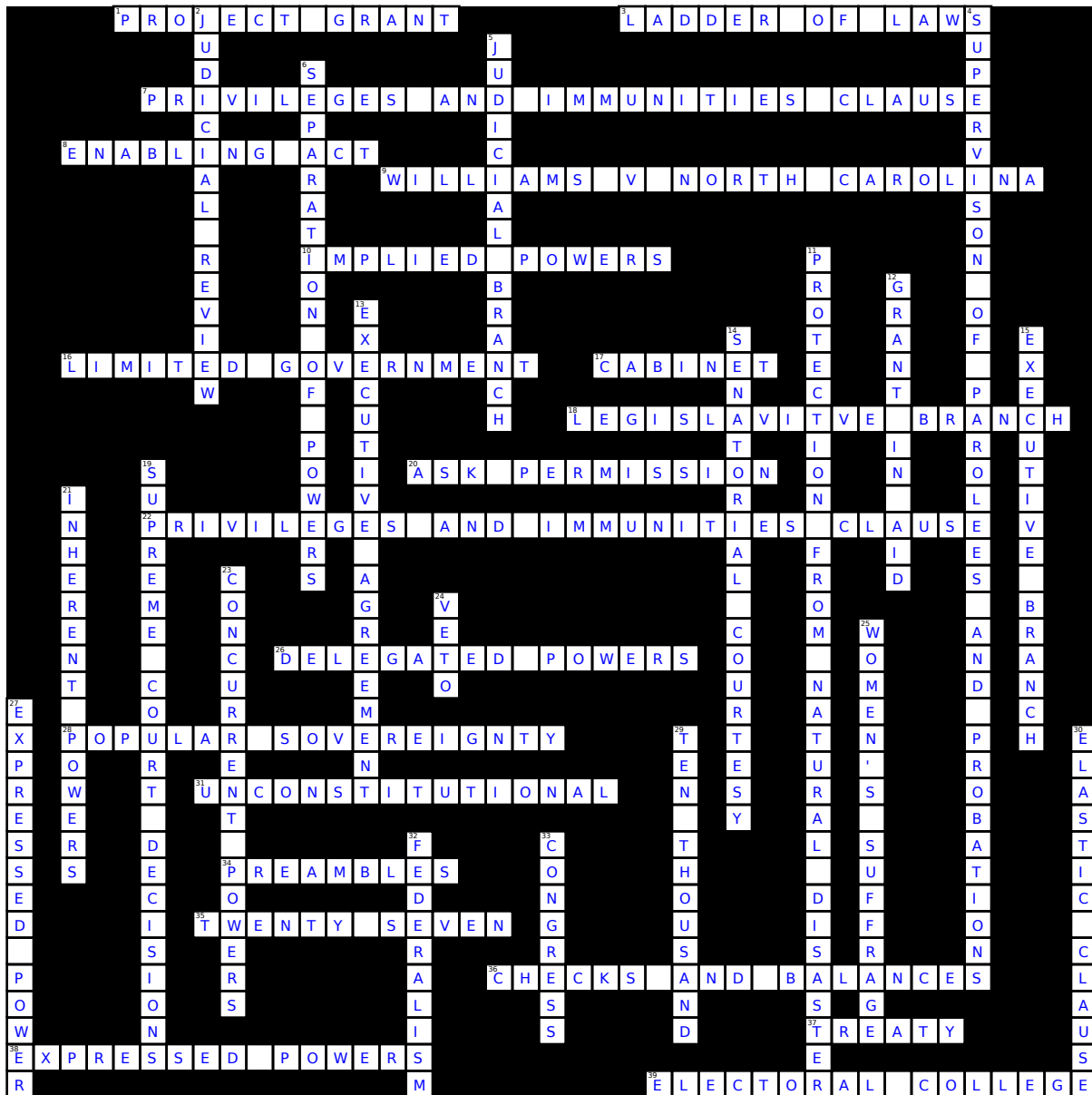

- The kind of "grant - in - aid" that has to be applied for
 - U.S constitution, acts of Congress and treaties, state constitutions; state statutes; local laws
 - constitutional principle that allows drivers holding a Texas Driver's Licence to operate a motor vehicles in any other State
 - act directing the people of a territory to write and ratify a constitution
 - Case that established the principle that the States were not required to apply full faith and credit to "quickie" divorces obtained in other states
 - powers reasonably thought to be granted, but not spelled out specifically in the Constitution
 - principle that holds that the government may do only those things that the people give it the power to do
 - advisory board to the president
 - Article 1 of the Constitution deals with this
 - process of admitting a new state into the Union starts with the residents having to _____
 - The Part of the Constitution that stops each state from discriminating against residents of other states
 - powers spelled out by the constitution
 - people are the only source of government
 - illegal; null and avoid; law that has no power or effect
 - States the purposes of the Constitution
 - number of amendments that have been passed since the ratification of the constitution
 - ability of Congress to confirm presidential appointment of the CIA is an example of which principle
 - a formal agreement between 2 or more sovereign nations
 - powers granted of teh National government in the constitution
 - the group that formally selects the nation's Presidents

- the power of the courts to decide whether governmental acts are unconstitutional
 - Compact that all 50 states have joined
 - Article 3 of the Constitution deals with this
 - governmental system with powers distriubted between 3 distinct branches
 - this is NOT an example of the National Government's obligation to states
 - money given by the National Government to States for use on a particular project
 - a pact the president makes with the head of a foreign state; do not require senatorial approval
 - custom that the Senate will approve only presidential appointees acceptable to the senators of the President's party
 - Article 2 of the Constitution deals with this
 - an informal process to change the Constitution
 - powers that belong to the National government because it is a sovereign state
 - powers possessed and excercised by both National and State governments
 - the president's rejection of an act of Congress
 - right not guaranteed in the bill of rights
 - power to collect taxes; power to declare war; power to coin money
 - number of proposed joint resolutions since the ratification of the constitution
 - also called the necessary and proper clause; has been stretched over the years to cover so many implied powers
 - division of power between a cental and state governments; is implied in the Constitution and expressed by the 10th amendment
 - The only body that can propose a formal amendment; can informally change the Constitution by passing laws that expand brief provisions of the Constitution
