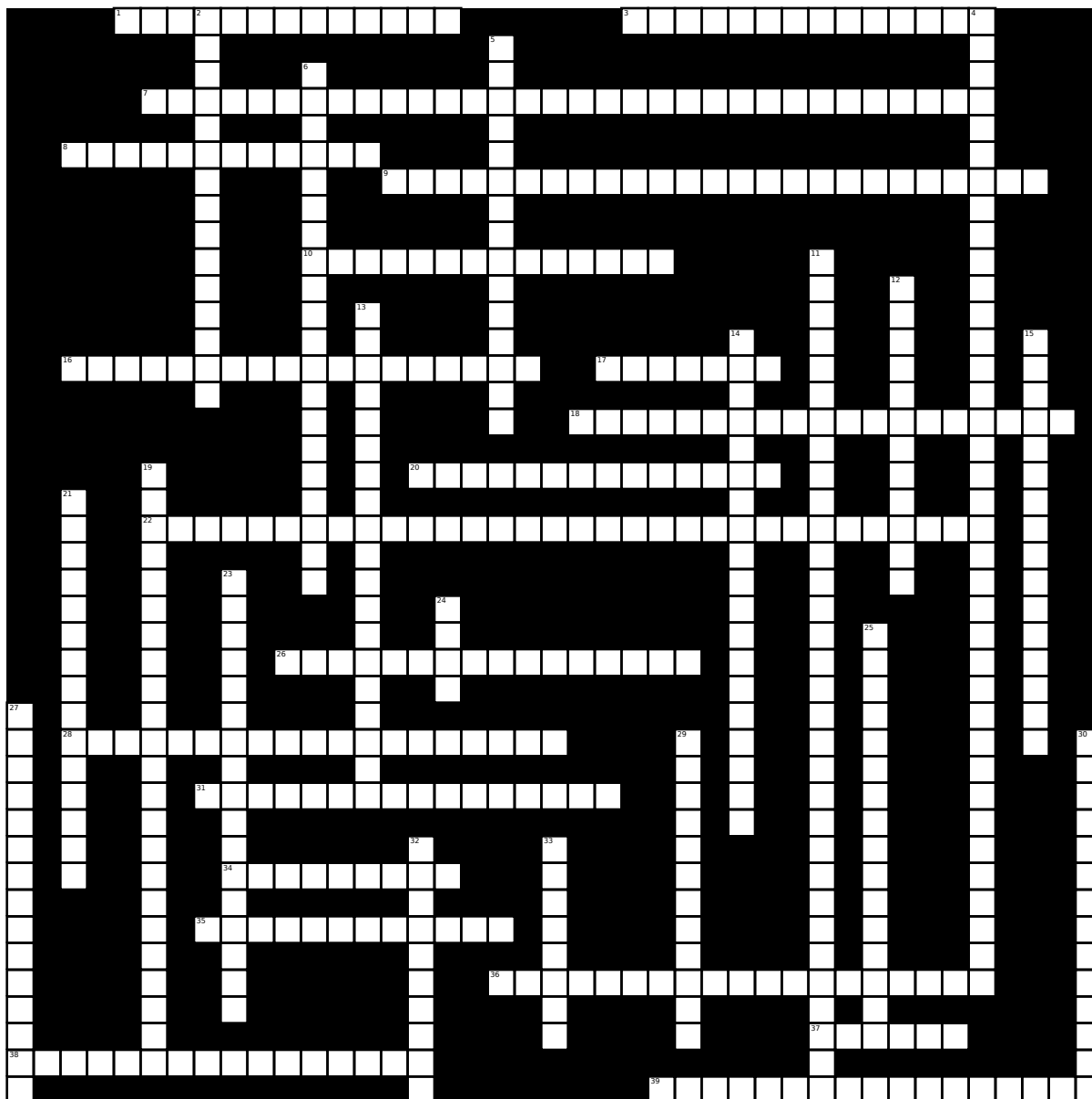

- 1 The kind of "grant - in - aid" that has to be applied for
- 3 U.S constitution, acts of Congress and treaties, state constitutions; state statutes; local laws
- 7 constitutional principle that allows drivers holding a Texas Driver's Licence to operate a motor vehicles in any other State
- 8 act directing the people of a territory to write and ratify a constitution
- 9 Case that established the principle that the States were not required to apply full faith and credit to "quickie" divorces obtained in other states
- 10 powers reasonably thought to be granted, but not spelled out specifically in the Constitution

- 2 the power of the courts to decide whether governmental acts are unconstitutional
- 4 Compact that all 50 states have joined
- 5 Article 3 of the Constitution deals with this
- 6 governmental system with powers distriubted between 3 distinct branches
- 11 this is NOT an example of the National Government's obligation to states
- 12 money given by the National Government to States for use on a particular project
- 13 a pact the president makes with the head of a foreign state; do not require senatorial approval
- 14 custom that the Senate will approve only presidential appointees acceptable to the senators of the President's party
- 15 Article 2 of the Constitution deals with this
- 19 an informal process to change the Constitution
- 21 powers that belong to the National government because it is a sovereign state
- 23 powers possessed and exercised by both National and State governments
- 24 the president's rejection of an act of Congress
- 25 right not guaranteed in the bill of rights
- 27 power to collect taxes; power to declare war; power to coin money
- 29 number of proposed joint resolutions since the ratification of the constitution
- 30 also called the necessary and proper clause; has been stretched over the years to cover so many implied powers
- 32 division of power between a cental and state governments; is implied in the Constitution and expressed by the 10th amendment
- 33 The only body that can propose a formal amendment; can informally change the Constitution by passing laws that expand brief provisions of the Constitution
